A public ceremony will be held on April 8<sup>th</sup> from 2 to 3pm at the Pioneer Park Pavilion to honor Army Special Forces Staff Sgt. Bryan Black, a Puyallup native who was killed in action in West Africa in 2017. He will receive a Medal for Heroism, and staff is encouraged to attend.

**Chair Bellerive**- Chair Bellerive expressed his excitement to have Vice Chair Palombi online. He thanked staff for their flexibility with the Board Workshop and expressed excitement about participating. Chair Bellerive also commended staff for organizing the Station 40 Open House, noting it was a great event.

**Vice Chair Palombi**- Vice Chair Palombi thanked staff and stated it was good to be back, expressing enthusiasm for continuing the work.

Commissioner Dannat- Commissioner Dannat welcomed Vice Chair Palombi back.
