

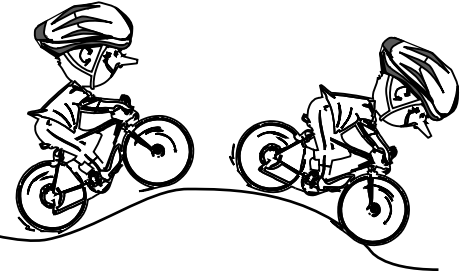

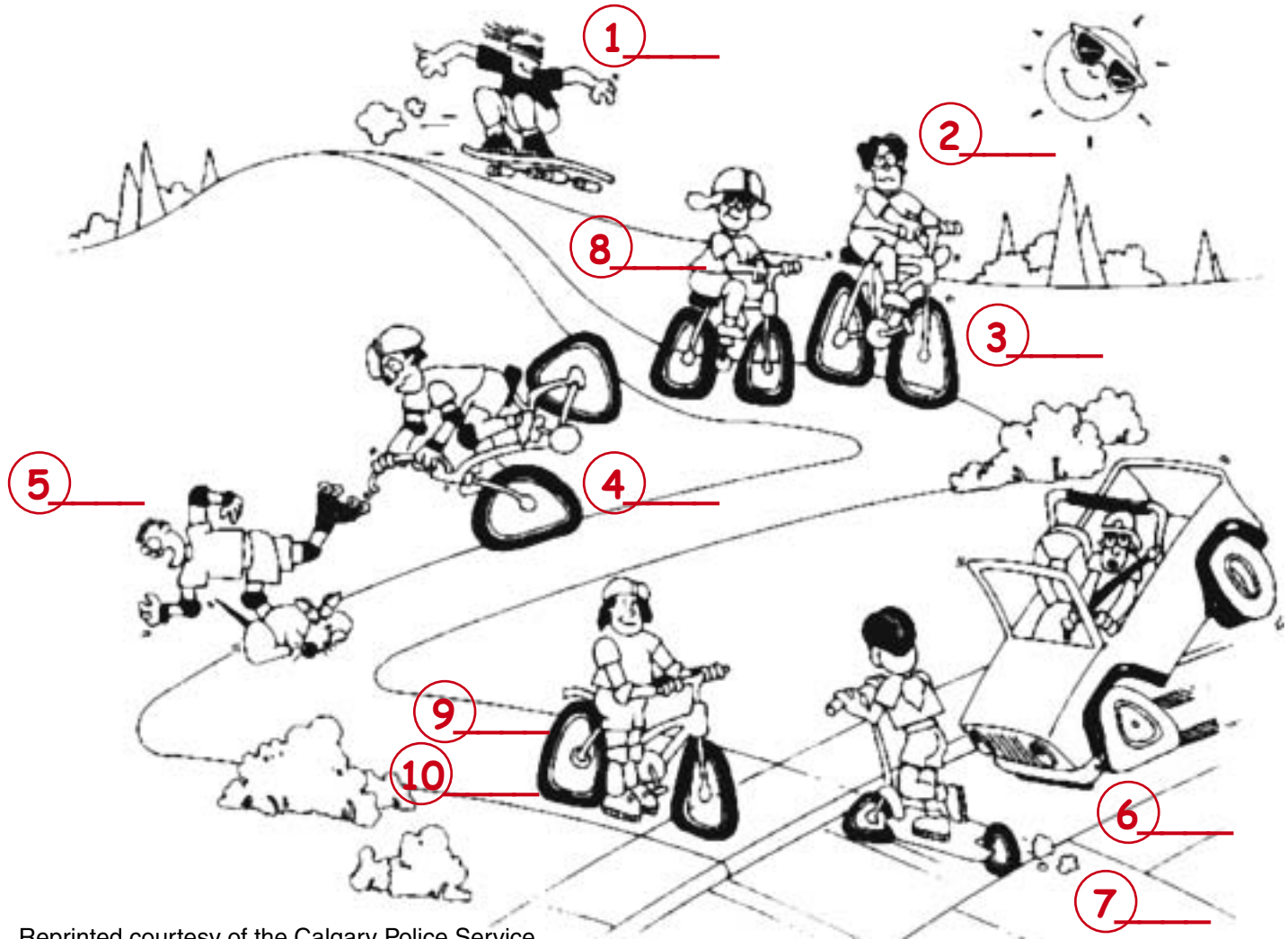

- A. Don't ride out into traffic
- B. Look before you cross the road. It is best to walk your bike through an intersection.
- C. Always wear safety gear and do not ride too fast.
- D. His bike is too big—his feet don't reach the pedals.
- E. Test your brakes before you hit the road—make sure your bike is safe.
- F. Watch out for objects in your path.
- G. Riding on the left hand side of the road.
- H. Ride on the right hand side of the road*
- I. Dismount your bike before crossing at an intersection with a crosswalk.
- J. Look left, right and left for traffic.*
