CREATING A NEW REGIONAL FIRE DISTRICT

On April 22, 2025, Graham and Orting voters will decide on Proposition 1 —merging their fire districts into a single regional fire service with Central Pierce Fire & Rescue.

POTENTIAL MERGER BENEFITS


- Faster, coordinated emergency response: closest available units dispatched for quicker 911 response.
- Shared resources: shared equipment, staffing, and facilities to improve service and reduce costs.
- Increased ability to adapt to future needs: in growth and public safety service demands.
- A new, unified fire district identity: honoring the legacy of each organization and its communities.

WHAT WOULDN'T CHANGE

- No job losses or station closures: firefighters and stations remain in place, with future investments planned for new and reactivated stations.
- No new funding requests (levy increases or bonds): the Fire Benefit Charge (FBC) will be standardized across the merged district.
